Description of the event:

For a number of years measures have been taken in Europe to improve the quality of drug prevention through developing and implementing quality standards, trainings and analysis of drug prevention systems. Based on the previous experience of such projects as EDPQS or UPC ADAPT over a dozen European countries (Italy, Belgium, Croatia, Estonia, Greece, Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Slovenia, Hungary) and organizations (UNODC, EMCDDA, EUSPR) have become involved in the project "Building effective drug prevention results across Europe, based on prevention systems analysis and widespread professional training (ASAP)". The aim of the side event is mainly to present the results of the ASAP project: results of the research into prevention systems and key drug prevention stakeholders in the EU; development and implementation of trainings for the prevention personnel; implementation of prevention standards; establishment of Virtual Community of Practices; development and implementation of the platform for online learning and best practices sharing in drug prevention. Importantly, the findings of the ASAP training might be implemented not only in Europe but on the other continents as well. The project is coordinated by A.Li.Sa (Azienda Ligure Sanitaria) Regione Liguria and financed by the European Commission.

ASAP-TRAINING AIMS

- **System and complex approach** to drug prevention identifying key stakeholders and conducting system analysis for the EU countries;
- **Prevention workforce competencies** and skills on quality standards and prevention science through the design and implementation of a two-layered training process (training for Master Trainers and Drug Prevention Professionals);
- **The adaptation of quality standards** in the different country systems applying existing guidelines.
- **Mechanisms to allow sustainability** of project activities through creation of stakeholders networks (thanks to a Virtual Community of Practice – VCP supported by a digital Platform).

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Countries' stakeholders map
- Countries' prevention system profile
- Designed training on main prevention science topics and prevention quality standards
- Tools and support for online learning and best practices sharing in order to improve the quality of preventive work.
